
And we're hard at work in 2016. Investing in infrastructure. Trimming trees. Strengthening our natural gas delivery system.

### Dig, Plant & Work Safely

Whether you're rototilling a new area for a garden, planting a tree or shrub, or building a fence this spring, remember that state law requires that you call 8-1-1 before you dig. It's a free service that can protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines, which can cause harm to you and those around you. Also:

- Plan before you plant! Trees that interfere with power lines pose an outage risk during storms, so avoid planting tall-growing trees and shrubs under power lines.
- Avoid planting anything around ground-mounted utility equipment; crews may need to access this equipment during outages.
- Keep ladders, tools, and materials at least 10 feet away from overhead power lines.
