

Important Information about Eversource Energy's Rates

On January 17, 2017, Eversource Energy submitted a proposal to the Department of Public Utilities (DPU) to update the company's electric rates. The proposal requests a net increase in annual delivery revenue of \$60.2 million, representing a 7 percent increase in those revenues to support our electric distribution operations.

On June 1, 2017, Eversource filed a revised rate design proposal with the DPU that shifts revenues between Eastern and Western Massachusetts as compared to the original proposal. This has the potential to change customer bill impacts.

Eversource's request addresses increases in operating and maintenance costs and capital costs associated with investments in the electric network since the last decision by the DPU approving a general distribution rate increase in 2006.

The DPU will review our request, conduct public hearings in Eversource's service area, and then make a decision by December 29, 2017 for new rates to become effective January 1, 2018. Part of Eversource's proposal to the DPU is to consolidate and align rate classifications in Massachusetts.

If approved by the DPU, distribution rates on January 1, 2018 would be as follows:

- For a typical residential non-heating customer an increase of \$10.29 per month for average use of 525 kWh per month, representing a 9 percent monthly increase.
- For a typical residential non-heating low-income customer a decrease of \$2.19 per month for average use of 438 kWh per month, representing a 3.4 percent monthly decrease.
- For a typical residential heating customer an increase of \$13.93 per month in the winter for average use of 817 kWh per month, representing a 8.3 percent increase. Also an increase of \$11.10 per month in the summer for average use of 590 kWh per month, representing a 8.8 percent increase;
- For a typical residential low-income heating customer a decrease of \$7.06 per month in the winter for average use of 889 kWh per month, representing a 5.9 percent decrease. Also a decrease of \$4.29 per month in the summer for average use of 548 kWh per month, representing a 5.4 percent decrease;
- Commercial and industrial bill impacts will vary significantly based on customer class and the amount of usage. Commercial and industrial customers should contact Eversource for specific bill impacts.
