

## How to Recognize a Natural Gas Leak — IT'S EASY!



Smell it. Natural gas is colorless and odorless. To make leak detection quick and easy, a harmless, non-toxic—but very unpleasant—odorant called "mercaptan" is added, which smells similar to rotten eggs or sulfur.

**See it.** You may see a white cloud, mist, fog, bubbles in standing water, blowing dust, or see vegetation that appears to be dead or dying for no apparent reason.

**Hear it.** You may hear unusual noises like roaring, hissing or whistling.

## What To Do When You Detect a Gas Leak









- Leave the area immediately and move to a safe place away from the suspected leak.
- Once in a safe environment, dial **9-1-1** immediately and then report the emergency to Eversource at **800-525-8222**.
- **DO NOT** smoke or operate electrical switches, appliances, cell phones and land lines. These items may produce a spark that can ignite the gas and cause an explosion.
- DO NOT assume someone else will report the condition.
- Provide emergency responders and Eversource with the exact location, including cross streets of the suspected leak.
- Let us know if digging activities are going on in the area.
