Stay Safe While Working Around the House



June is National Safety Month and whether your do-it-yourself projects are inside or out in the yard, Eversource has a variety of tips to help keep you safe while you work, including:

Watch That Ladder — When you're working with ladders or using power tools outdoors, stay as far away as possible from any overhead wires. The plastic coating on your ladder or tools will not protect you from a shock and even a quick brush against an energized wire can cause serious harm.

Dig Safely — If you're planning a project that involves any type of digging, you are required by state law to call Dig Safe at 811 or 888-DIG-SAFE at least 72 hours before you begin digging to have the location of any underground utilities marked. This **free service** can protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines, which can cause harm to you and those around you, and potentially make you liable for fines and repair costs.

Plant Wisely — When planting trees on your property, make sure to plant the right tree in the right place. Trees and power lines don't mix. When they touch, it can cause power outages, fires, downed lines and safety hazards for people, wildlife, and even the trees themselves.

Use Electrical Cords Wisely — Check your extension cords for signs of wear and replace them if they are frayed or cracked. Prolonged use of damaged extension cords can cause overheating and fire. Consider switching to advanced power strips that sense when your electronic devices are idle and automatically prevent them from drawing power.

Install a Carbon Monoxide Detector — If you already have one that's battery-powered, replace the batteries. And be sure your fuel-powered appliances are properly vented to prevent carbon monoxide build-up.
