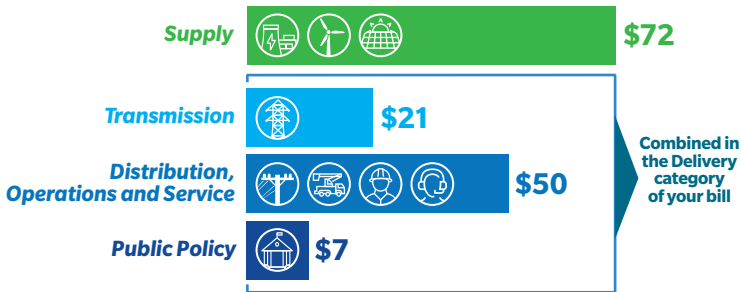


Your Electric Bill: What Are You Paying For?

If your electric bill was \$150, the breakdown would look like this:



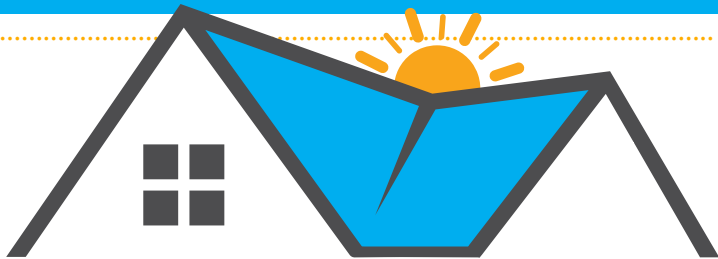
