NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 19-SQ-14 April 2, 2019

Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities into Western Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy's 2018 Service Quality Report filed pursuant to Service Quality Standards for Electric Distribution Companies and Local Gas Distribution Companies, D.P.U. 12-120-D (2015).

On March 1, 2019, Western Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Company") filed with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") the Company's 2018 electric service quality report ("2018 SQ Report") for the period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. The Company's 2018 SQ Report compares its performance during 2018 with the Department's SQ guidelines set forth in Service Quality Standards for Electric Distribution Companies and Local Gas Distribution Companies, D.P.U. 12-120-D (2015) ("SQ Guidelines"), and the Company's electric SQ plan that the Department approved in Western Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy, D.P.U. 16-90 (2017). Per the SQ Guidelines, electric distribution companies may be subject to penalties for failure to meet the Department's SO performance standards for: System Average Interruptions Duration Index ("SAIDI"); System Average Interruptions Frequency Index ("SAIFI"); Circuit Average Interruptions Duration Index ("CKAIDI"); Circuit Average Interruptions Frequency Index ("CKAIFI"); Service Appointments; and the number of Consumer Division cases. The Department docketed the Company's 2018 electric SQ Report as D.P.U. 19-SQ-14. On March 18, 2019, the NSTAR Electric Company also filed a request to consolidate the SQ benchmarks and plans of NSTAR Electric Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company, both d/b/a Eversource Energy. The Department has docketed that request as D.P.U. 19-47, and will consider that filing separately in that docket.

The Department will accept written comments on the Company's 2018 SQ Report. Any person interested in commenting on this matter may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **May 17, 2019**. One original and one copy of all written documents must be filed with Mark D. Marini, Secretary, Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, 5th Floor, Boston, Massachusetts 02110. In addition, one copy of all written comments should be sent to the Company's attorney, John Habib, Esq., Keegan Werlin LLP, 99 High Street, 29th Floor, Boston, Massachusetts 02110.

All documents should also be submitted to the Department in electronic format using one of the following methods: (1) by e-mail attachment to dpu.efiling@mass.gov and lauren.morris@mass.gov, or (2) on a USB drive. The text of the e-mail or USB drive must

specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 19-SQ-14); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document.
